

# Preeclampsia with Severe Features Debrief Form

Criteria for Preeclampsia with Severe features includes:

- ✓ *Systolic blood pressure of 160 mm Hg or higher OR Diastolic blood pressure of 110 mg Hg or higher ON at least two occasions at least 4 hours apart while the patient is on bed rest (unless antihypertensive medication was initiated before this time)*
- ✓ *Thromocytopenia (platelet count less than 100,000/mL)*
- ✓ *Impaired liver function:*
  - *Elevated transaminases (2x the normal)*
  - *Severe persistent unexplained RUQ or epigastric pain-unresponsive to medication*
- ✓ *Progressive renal insufficiency (serum creatinine greater than 1.1 OR a doubling of the serum creatinine concentration)*
- ✓ *Pulmonary Edema*
- ✓ *New onset cerebral or Visual Disturbances*

Team members present for debrief: must have MD present

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Outcome of case:

- Continued hospitalization; Reasons include- Check all that apply:  Less than 34 weeks  
 Greater than 34 weeks  observation upon admit (24-48hours)  corticosteroid administered  
 MgSO4 administration  Antihypertensive medications
- Transfer to higher level of care
- Delivery: cesarean \_\_\_\_\_ vaginal \_\_\_\_\_
- Eclampsia  Pulmonary Edema  DIC  Uncontrolled Severe Hypertension  Nonviable fetus  Abnormal fetal test results  Abruption  Intrapartum Fetal Demise
